

Stone Arch Bridges & Scenic Views

Sites along the Kaskaskia-Cahokia Trail offer magnificent views and terrific opportunities to experience local history. Step back in time and encounter European style stone bridges, take a hike and see where salt was once manufactured 800 feet above sea level, and enjoy an evening of cocktails and dinner while watching the sunset over the Mississippi River.

Points of Interest*

- Kaskaskia-Cahokia Trail Remnant with Stone Arch Bridge (South of Bellfontaine House, 709 Church St., Waterloo) *Also visit the Bellefontaine House and Spring, one of the first American settlements in Illinois.*
- Maeystown Creek Stone Arch Bridge (Maeystown) Take a stroll along the shady creek in this quaint historic German town.



- Salt Lick Point Reserve and Trails (1309 Limestone Lane, Valmeyer) Take a hike on the Salt Lick Trail which traverses the bluffs and offers scenic views of the floodplain below. The easily hiked Johnson Trail at the base of the bluffs features showy wildflowers.
- Gall Road Stone Arch Bridge (6 Gall Rd., Columbia). *Visit Columbia's POP-UP SHOP also located here in an historic one room schoolhouse.*
